1. 1st XV fixtures for January

The League season picks up again with an away game at West Leeds on Saturday, 6 January. The other games in January are :

The postponed Penrith (Away) game has been re-scheduled to Saturday, 10 February.

2. 2nd XV Fixtures

The fixtures for the second half of the season are now confirmed, with our 2nd XV competing against the other five teams that finished in the bottom half of the Merit Premiership League : Old Brodleians, Ilkley, York, Huddersfield and Cleckheaton.

3. Lunch opportunity

You'll know (we hope) that our 1st XV has progressed to the semi-finals of the Yorkshire Cup with a home draw against local rivals Hull. This is set for **Saturday, 24 February** – put the date on your calendar.

4. RFU National Draw

Over 9,000 tickets have been given to a series of coordinators, who are distributing tickets to all members, playing and non-playing. We hope that you have now received yours, and have made good progress selling their allocation to friends, family and colleagues. Remember that Selby RUFC raised £18,140 last year!

This is much-needed financial help for the Club, and your help making it a success is very much appreciated. The club makes 90p tax-free from every £1 of tickets sold as the RFU arranges everything needed to take part in the fund raising: prizes, tickets, instructions, promotional material – even the postage is pre-paid.

There is still plenty of time to get them sold, as they do not need to be sent off to the RFU until the end of February. If you have sold your tickets please return them to your coordinator. If that is not convenient simply put the stubs and the cash in an envelope, with your name on the outside, and drop them into the Club when you are next passing. **Please do not leave them in the post box outside**, as that is not secure.

8. Simplified law book

World Rugby's 'simplified law book' has been launched to enhance accessibility and understanding without altering the laws themselves. The result is a law book that is more logically laid out, clearer in its explanations and, with various repetitions and contradictions removed, 42 per cent shorter than the version it replaces.

The revolutionary law book is the product of almost two years' work by a specialist group – you can see it at laws.worldrugby.org and download it via the App store.

Now we realise that not everyone has read the law book, and there will always be differences of opinion about whether the laws are known and applied correctly, but now you have an opportunity to read them yourself, if you want.
